FROM BISHOP SCARFE

At its Synod last year in Eswatini, our companion Diocese of Swaziland challenged its companion dioceses to partner with them in becoming a Green Diocese. They highlighted aspects to which they were committing—for example, work to reduce plastic pollution, and participation in the Anglican Season of Creation. We were invited to adapt their resolution to our own situation or context. And we resolved to do just that at our own Convention, a month later.

Many of us as consumers have been working at reducing our use of plastic, though it is not as easy as it sounds. Households and congregations have undertaken audits of their carbon footprint, and some have developed their outside space as neighborhood gardens or sought to redevelop "postage stamp" prairies. And so, as fall comes around, we are all invited to delve deeper into the call of celebrating and committing to the stewardship and welfare of God's creation through participating in the educational and liturgical offerings of Season of Creation, which runs from September 1 through October 4th (Feast of St Francis)...
