ADVENT IN THE HOME

REVERSE ADVENT

(brought to you by our good friends at Building Faith | A Ministry of Virginia Seminary)

Reverse & Reach Out

Turn your "want list" into someone else's "need list" as you focus this Advent season on the journey to Bethlehem. In a time of uncertainty, Mary and Joseph gathered what they had and traveled to Bethlehem to be counted in the census. What would they eat? Would they be warm? What did they need for themselves& a baby?

Reverse Advent:

A Spiritual Discipline of Reaching Out

- 1. **Gather** 4 plain brown paper bags (one for each week of Advent)
- 2. **Attach** a sign on each bag indicating the items to be collected.
- 3. **Decide** as a family when and how you will practice this spiritual discipline of Reaching Out. You may choose to fill your bag all at once or add one item each day during Advent. The choice is yours.
- 4. On Sunday morning, come for drive-up, contactless communion in the circle drive between 11 and 11:30 am (after the 10:15 am live-stream service), then **deliver** your filled bag (or monetary contribution) to the parking lot entrance. To make this a contactless drop off, please place your bags in the back or trunk of your vehicle. When you see the volunteer, please open the back of your vehicle and the volunteer will retrieve the bags. *If* you are not able to drop off your items on Sunday, please place items in plastic totes near parking lot doors.

ADVENT 1 | November 23-29

What food would they need for their journey to Bethlehem?

Place non-perishable **FOOD ITEMS** in bag #1 for those living with food insecurity.

Talk about the role of food in your own life.

Pray for the families in our community who are living with food insecurity.

ADVENT 2 | November 30-December 6 What did they need for warmth?

Place **WARM CLOTHES** (hats, gloves, scarves, socks) in bag #2 for the homeless. Talk about the clothes you wear to stay warm in the winter. Pray for those who have little or no shelter from the cold.

ADVENT 3 | December 7-13

How would they care for themselves?

Place **BASIC TOILETRIES** (toothpaste, toothbrush, comb, deodorant, soap, shampoo, nail clippers /file) in bag #3 for the housing insecure. Talk about the things you need each day to care for yourself. Pray for those who often have to choose between food and basic care items for survival.

ADVENT 4 | December 14-20

How would they care for a baby?

Place **BABY ITEMS** (bottles, diapers, wipes, etc.) in bag #4 for the infants and toddlers. Talk about the many ways babies depend on their caregivers for basic needs. Pray for those who are caring for infants and toddlers.

What on earth is Angel Tree? Angel Tree is our way of using the Advent season to make Christmas a brighter time for families with needs beyond their means. It's a way we can use our blessings to bless others.

This year, St. Timothy's has adopted four families with a total of 15 children. The parents have specified for each child something they want, something they need, something to wear, something to read." That means we have a total of 60 gift opportunities for these children. In addition, we will try to provide parents with grocery gift cards and, perhaps, a gift or two.

We have only a "virtual" Angel Tree this year, So you can't come in to pick an "ornament" off our tree as in previous years. Therefore, if your family would like to participate, please contact Mary or Jeanie or the office and we'll supply you with a child's name and something from his or her list, or if you prefer, a family name for you to gift with a grocery gift card. We ask that gifts be returned, wrapped and labeled, as part of the post-communion drop-off on one of the Sundays in Advent, but no later than December 20.
