ABOUT THE CLOSE TO HOME LOGO:

"As we brainstormed imagery to convey this theme, we were drawn to architectural blueprints as a visual symbol and theological metaphor. Blueprints are tangible glimpses of a vision actively and intentionally pursued. They are precise and will inevitably be revised. Blueprints give builders the information they need to

bring a dream to life. In many ways, the Advent scriptures are like blueprints—detailing the dreams of a God who makes a home with us.

The icon in our Close to Home logo conveys a theological concept of home. The hands express our deep longing for connection, intimacy, and for God to come close. As the hands—representing both God's hands and the hands of humanity—draw closer to one another, they form a structure of home. The home structure is not one dimensional; it expands outward, with a doorway offering an open invitation to us all. The hands break through the house structure, centering human connection and mirroring the inbreaking of God in our lives. The logo is both structural and personal, comforting and nostalgic—reminding us of the ways God's home is close but not yet complete."

CAMPUS PROJECTS BY DAN MONTGOMERY

Several campus projects that had been deferred for several years were completed in 2021:

- New screens were installed in the classrooms by the step garden and accountant's office
- Crumbling concrete on the patio and near the red doors was replaced
- Trees along 24th street and outside the preschool were trimmed
- Landscaping around the new church sign was completed
- A new columbarium wall was installed.

Outstanding tax-savings opportunity for older taxpayers - the IRA Charitable Roll-over.

If you are over 70 ½ years old, you must take the Required Minimum Distribtuion (RMD) out of your IRA every year. But, you are permitted to roll-over funds out of your IRA and make gifts to charities. The making of such a direct gift (1) counts towards satisfying the annual RMD, and (2) keeps the gifted amount entirely out of your taxable income.

ORDINATION - ABIGAIL LIVINGOOD

On Saturday, December 4, I will be one of three candidates in the diocese who will be ordained as Transitional Deacons. You are my sponsoring/sending parish and are currently my internship site. I work here with both the permission of Luther Seminary and this Diocese as part of my educational program. Mary Cole-Duvall has been my supervisor and there is an Internship Committee that has met with me monthly to support me, guide me in different parish life areas and evaluate my work.

Both my schooling at Luther Seminary, St. Paul, MN, and this internship started in June of 2020 and will continue through May 2022. My goal in going to seminary is to become an ordained Episcopal priest and the ordination as a



deacon in December is the next step in this process and will be followed, I hope, in 6 months with ordination as a priest. Between now and then I will continue to be in school fulltime, work at St. Tim's part-time, and I will sit for the General Ordination Exam (GOE) – January 3-7, 2022. All of my classes are on-line - by design. The exception will be my upcoming winter term 2022. It will be a short but intense study time in Germany primarily in Berlin in the Dietrich Bonhoeffer House. I will graduate on June 5, 2022.

December 3: Learn! | Visit www.dmarcunited.org/pantry-locations/ and count how many pantries and how many mobile pantry sites we have in the metro area.

December 4: Canned Meat | DMARC provides canned Tuna, Chicken, and even Sardines in our pantries. Please make sure it is within the best by date!
December 5: Toilet Paper | DMARC provides hygiene supplies. Even if a package of TP is open, we can still receive it.
