



The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

## Glory to you Lord Christ.

When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. Then Jesus said, "Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing." And they cast lots to divide his clothing. The people stood by, watching Jesus on the cross; but the leaders scoffed at him, saying, "He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, his chosen one!" The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine, and saying, "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!" There was also an inscription over him, "This is the King of the Jews."

One of the criminals who were hanged there kept deriding him and saying, "Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!" But the other rebuked him, saying, "Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? And we indeed have been condemned justly, for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds, but this man has done nothing wrong." Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." He replied, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

#### **Nicene Creed**

We believe in one God. the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. <sup>\*</sup> When the Nicene Creed was written at the ecumenical councils of the 4<sup>th</sup> century, it stated that the Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father.

The now-familiar phrase "and the Son" was added several centuries later by Western Christians without the approval of Eastern Christians, who have continued using the original wording. Debate over this addition became a source of division between the Roman Catholic and Eastern Orthodox churches. In its ecumenical dialogues with Orthodox churches, the Episcopal Church agreed that future publications of the Creed would drop the phrase "and the Son" in solidarity with Eastern Christians as a sign of the church's unity.


