## **2023 ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

- With COVID restrictions easing, we were able to gather more frequently for social events, such as Parish Picnics, an Epiphany Party, and our Lenten Suppers.
- Four parishioners joined Rev. Jeanie Smith to take part in the Genesis II program, which helps congregations expand their imaginations for how to do ministry. The Genesis II Team has several ideas in the works, including a new formation program launching in September.
- More than a dozen newcomers gathered with longer-time members of St. Timothy's at our Newcomers Dinner in February.
- The vestry identified several goals and formed two teams to help address two of the top priorities, one team to look at the long-range needs of our buildings and grounds, and another to strengthen our Children's and Youth Formation.
- We held a five-week Lenten series that included worship, a dinner, and formation for children, youth, and adults.
- Bishop Betsey Monnot made her first official visitation to St. Timothy's in April, at which she confirmed or received six adults and six youth. Five more youth were confirmed in September.
- Through our 2nd Offering, we provided more than \$24,000 (so far!) to organizations benefiting the community.

- The Faith + Grace Garden expanded into the northwest corner of our property that was cleared last fall, and has produced and donated 22,000 pounds of produce as of September 2.
- St. Timothy's continued to reach out to those in need in our community through programs like the Casserole Ministry and the Grocery Ministry.
- Des Moines area Episcopal congregations held a full-week VBS for the first time since before the pandemic.
- We enjoyed a time of worship and fellowship together with our neighbors at Covenant Presbyterian in August.
- We continue to livestream our services, and our number of views remains comparable to when streaming was introduced, suggesting that we continue to reach newcomers and homebound members even as people have returned to inperson worship.
- A plan was created and funds were raised to renew the downstairs Adult Formation room (rechristened the Gathering Center) with new furniture and technology.

### 2024 BUDGET KEY DRIVERS

- Non pledge income reflects new families as well as parishioners who do not submit a pledge
- Given our current households and expected attrition, we are asking for a 4% increase over your 2023 pledge in order to achieve our 2024 goal
- Decreased holiday income reflects recent experience
- + Preschool reimbursements are on pause
- The 2024 budget does not include a Designated Funds Transfer from our balance sheet required to balance the budget

- Continued increase in Diocesan pledge; preliminary expected ask is approx. \$68k
- Personnel: Salaries raised to \$15 per hour for staff below that rate; 2% increase for remaining staff
- Communications: Internet rate increase
- Property: discontinued HVAC reserve expense; approx. \$110k will be on balance sheet by 12/31/2023 for next phase of HVAC upgrade
