The First Reading Jonah 3:1-5, 10

The word of the Lord came to Jonah a second time, saying, "Get up, go to Nineveh, that great city, and proclaim to it the message that I tell you." So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly large city, a three days' walk across. Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's walk. Gospel Mark 1:14-20

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark. Glory to you Lord Christ.
