The Des Moines Catholic Worker House (DMCWH) provides hospitality and support to all members of our community. We serve two daily meals five days a week, reaching approximately 700 guests weekly. As a "come as you are" home, we meet people where they are and ask no questions. In addition to meals, we provide access to showers and a "store" that distributes food, personal hygiene supplies, and clothing.

Every November, we also distribute new coats, hats, and gloves to unsheltered individuals. This service is provided without any forms or requirements; if someone needs a coat, they receive one.

DMCWH has been serving the community since 1976 at 1310 7th St, Des Moines. We are 100% privately funded and do not receive any federal or state assistance. Your continued support is vital to these efforts, and any contribution is deeply appreciated and used responsibly.

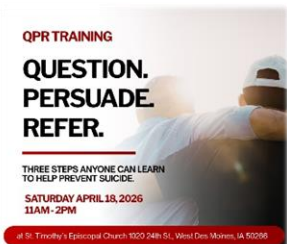
